Some reminders from Auckland Netball

- Netball is played in the rain and it is very rarely postponed due to weather. Extreme wind, thunder and lightning may cause games to be called off and/or postponed due to Health & Safety. Main school contacts will be contacted either by email or text and notifications put on the homepage of our web site, our Default telephone line and on Facebook if a postponement is required. Please check these before phoning the office.
- The whole area of the Windmill Park venue is a Smoke Free environment.
- Teams must check in at the Control Room on arrival so we know your team has arrived.
- The first team to check-in will be handed the scorecard.
- Teams are responsible for making sure that players have removed all jewellery and that their finger nails are trimmed and smooth. Any breaches of these rules will be referred back to the team to deal with.
- Spectators are to stand along the side of the court in the green areas. The blue court area is for the players and one coach from each team. Goal lines must be spectator free and please do not allow children to play on the portable goal posts. Please keep all gear bags, prams etc well clear of the blue court area.
- We are all responsible for providing a positive safe experience for our players. Teams are asked to monitor the behaviour of their own community especially the spectators on the side-lines.
- Please help us to protect and preserve the wonderful rubberized court surface. The sign at the front gate (as below) is to remind us of what is not permitted to prevent damage to the surface. In particular please ask your community to keep their dogs at home (excluding Guide dogs).
